

## PUPIL PREMIUM FUNDING 2016-17

### What is Pupil Premium?

Pupil Premium is additional funding given to schools and academies to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils and close the gap between them and their peers. Introduced in April 2011, schools and academies receive funding based on the number of pupils who have been eligible for free school meals at any point in the last 6 years. Allocation of funding is based on pupils eligible recorded on the January 2016 School Census. Each school can decide how they spend the pupil premium but will be held to account to show the impact it has had.

### How will we make decisions about the spending of the pupil premium grant?

We will ensure that the Pupil Premium funding is targeted to support disadvantaged pupils.

We will make reference to the latest research and reports on effective deployment of funding to secure improved outcomes for pupils eligible for the pupil premium funding to inform decisions on allocation of funding.

We use analysis of recent patterns and trends in the performance and engagement of pupils eligible for pupil premium compared to other pupils to inform decisions on the most effective ways of spending this funding.

We will involve the Governing Body in planning the spending of this funding.

We will ensure that that deployment of funding reflects and enhances the learning opportunities for all groups of learners eligible for the fund and not just lower attaining pupils.

We will include targeted initiatives which will improve attendance, behaviour or links with parents where these present as barriers for learning for individual or groups of pupils.

We will refine and introduce new initiatives and intervention which are responsive to the needs of pupils through the year.

We will regularly monitor the quality and improvements in outcomes for disadvantaged pupils.

Impact Measures - In order to evaluate the effectiveness of our pupil premium spending to improve outcomes for our disadvantage children we will consider :

- Attainment and progress of pupils eligible for the pupil premium grant in reading, writing and mathematics compared to non-pupil premium pupils. We will look at the within school gaps and compare achievements against national standards. Where we observe gaps in achievement, we agree ways to narrow that gap so that all children attain well against local and national standards.
- Attendance data
- Exclusion data and other indicators of improvements in behaviour
- Engagement with extracurricular activities and events.

- Pupil voice through questionnaires and interviews
- Parent feedback through questionnaires.

Objectives of spending PP: In addition to the main aims Corvedale CE Primary School;

- aims for all KS1 pupils to close the attainment gap of eligible pupils and their peers.
- aims for all KS2 pupils to close the attainment gap between eligible pupils and their peers.
- aims to ensure floor standards at the end of KS2 are achieved.
