Dear Parents/Carers,

Covid-19 (Coronavirus)

As you're probably aware, the government's guidance on the coronavirus has changed from the 'contain' phase to one of delaying the spread of the virus. We're getting in touch to let you know what we're doing in light of this, and what we expect from all of you, to help make sure our school community keeps safe and calm.

We'd like to reassure you that at Corvedale CE Primary School we're taking all of the necessary steps to protect our community and are continuing to follow official guidance from the government.

What's the current situation?

- The **school remains open** - this is the current official guidance we've been given
- All school functions continue to run as normal with a few exceptions
- Pupils should attend unless they feel unwell - if your child has any of the following symptoms, they should remain at home for 7 days:
 - a new, continuous cough and/or
 - a temperature

If your child is unwell, report this as you would normally by informing the school office via admin@corvedaleprimary.co.uk or head@corevdaleprimary.co.uk or telephoning 01584 841630 before 09:30

- **Bikeability & Balanceability is still taking place**
- **All after-school clubs are cancelled** until further advice
- **Parents' consultation evenings and Y6 SAT Information evening are cancelled**
- **Book fair is cancelled**
- We'll keep you up to date with any changes to the current situation via letters, Twitter and the school website

What we're doing to protect and support pupils and staff:

- We will contact you should your child feel unwell, develop a temperature and/or persistent cough to ask you to collect your child immediately
- We will encourage all pupils to continue with regular hand-washing. Anti-bacterial hand wash is available to be used in toilets and classrooms and children will be encouraged to wash their hands on arrival at school and throughout the day. If your child is suffering from dry hands, please feel free to send in hand lotion for their personal use only.

- We will support the pupils through lessons and assemblies to respond to any questions pupils
- We have added a dedicated page to the school website to provide details of any actions that parents need to be aware of and will provide updates to this. There are also links to websites we regularly use in school so that children can access them in order for them to continue their learning.

What we need you to do:

- If you've recently changed your contact details, please inform the school office via admin@corvedaleprimary.co.uk or head@corevdaleprimary.co.uk or telephoning 01584 841630 **as soon as possible**
- Talk to your children about the coronavirus. It's a scary time and we should make sure children feel supported. [BBC Newsround](#) has regular updates for younger children and [YoungMinds](#) has practical steps older children can take to help with anxiety
- Come and collect your child straight away, if we ask you to (we'll contact you if they become ill with either a temperature or a new, continuous cough)

What happens if the school has to close?

We'll only close if we're either officially advised to do so or we don't have enough staff to run the school.

In either case, we'll alert parents/carers to closure and proposed dates for reopening via Twitter and the school website. Should this happen, further information will be shared with you to enable pupils to access learning during a closure.

Please keep in mind that we're only sending out this information to help the school community prepare. **There are currently no plans to close** but this may change.
