Congratulations Father John

On Sunday 12th October a coach full of parishioners from the Corvedale Parishes attended a lovely service at Hereford cathedral conducted by Bishop Richard. We all went to support and watch as Father John was appointed to the College of Canons.

The Revd John Beesley, Rector of the Corvedale Benefice, was installed as Prebendary de Prato Majore.

It was a lovely service which he shared with The Revd Jeannetta Stokes, Vicar of the Worfield Benefice and Rural Dean of the Severn Borders Deanery, who was installed as Prebendary de Pionia Parva.

Prebendaries are senior clergy, appointed by the Bishop in recognition of their ministry and giving a particular link with the Cathedral. Some Cathedrals call their Prebendaries 'Honorary Canons'. Prebendary is the term used, originally, in 'non-monastic' Cathedrals such as Hereford.

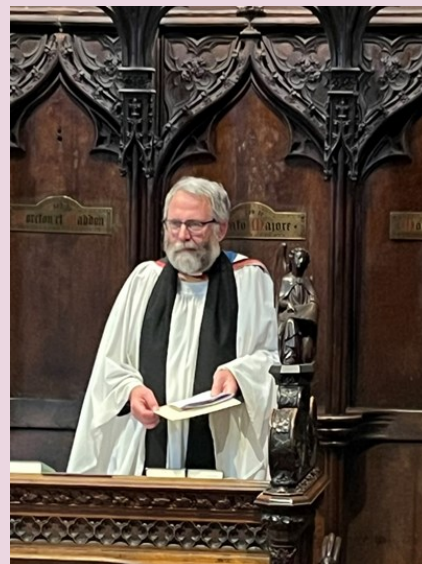
A 'Prebend' was a portion of land – often a farm, the income of which provided an income to support the Prebendary. The income for such posts has long since disappeared but the title remains as a rather lovely tradition!

You might never have heard of Prato Majore, but these were ancient pieces of land from which Father John would have got an income to help maintain the great cathedral.

He has a special seat up near the altar behind the choir stalls. The seat tips up to make it higher. Years ago the Canons had to stand through very long services so the tipped up seat made a perch, it looked like they were standing but they were really sitting!!

Under Father John's new seat is a very old carving. Each seat is different. Father John's is a leopard leaping on another animal's neck. (How did they know what a leopard looked like?)

Father John has been recognised by the Bishop for all his hard work and we are very lucky to have him at our school. We send him our warm congratulations.

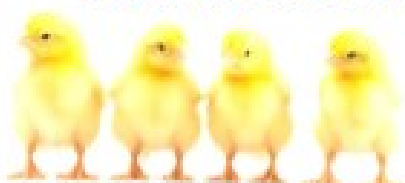
